Sir,

This is my last letter to help normalize relations between the west and the DPRK.

As I wrote before, I am willing to fly to China and then North Korea to visit with your Supreme Leader, Kim Jong-un in February or March. The purpose is to discuss changes that he may want to make in the DPRK-USA relationship and provide a goodwill gesture by making changes that the west will see as positive.

That goodwill gesture is the release of Kenneth Bae, your prisoner. In exchange, when elected, I will act as a liaison to open the door to communication between the DPRK, the Congress and our President.

I know that your Supreme Leader wants to have some communications with our administration, notably President Obama and his successor.

Your government has no communication channels with our government, and I wish to resolve that at the very least. When countries speak, they reach common ground. That is the first step to peace. Peace leads to prosperity. You will no longer have to rely on your Kaesong Industrial Region in the south, and you "Made in China" labeled manufacturing of clothing in the north, sold in this country as Chinese products.

Ongoing hostilities drain huge financial resources from a country. I can help fix the relationship and bring peace.

Actions speak louder than words, so if interested in normalizing relations let me know.
